



MISSION STATEMENT AND GUIDELINES

100+ Women Who Care in Rhode Island is a group of women who are dedicated to supporting the work of local nonprofit organizations throughout the state of Rhode Island. Our mission and purpose is to maximize women's leadership in philanthropy by engaging and educating our membership about the community work of these organizations and strengthening their impact through our collective giving. We strive to make a difference in Rhode Island.

100 + Women Who Care in Rhode Island will be governed by a peer-led Steering Committee comprised of at least 5 members. The steering committee will meet a minimum of two times a year.

GUIDELINES

Each member commits to donating at their selected level at each meeting, regardless of their ability to attend the quarterly meeting. To ensure that the organization is open and inclusive to all women, there are tiers for monetary commitment. Each of the membership levels has equal voting rights.

Meetings:

Meetings will take place quarterly and will be one hour or less.

Meetings are open. Guests are welcome to attend but only members are eligible to vote.

Membership and Donations:

Members can donate in the following ways:

- by donating through our online donation partner, Grapevine
- by bringing a check to a meeting to be written out directly to the selected nonprofit once it is announced
- by mailing it after the meeting as directed once recipient is announced
- by donating directly to the nonprofit through the organization's online giving portal
(members must notify 100+WWCRI that they have donated online, and follow directions to attribute their donation as part of 100+WWCRI in the online donation portal)

100 Women Who Care RI's intention is that 100% of contributions stay in the state of Rhode Island to benefit local communities. The mission and constituency of the nominated nonprofit must meet this criteria. International or national nonprofits that do not work for the benefit of the RI community will not be considered.

Contributions will NOT be made to:

- *Organizations without 501(c)(3) tax-exempt public nonprofit status as defined by the Internal Revenue Service.*
- *Individuals.*
- *Organizations that: 1) Promote a particular political, religious, or ideological point of view; 2) advocate for a particular program of social or political action; 3) support specific public policies or legislation; 4) lobby.*
- *Religious institutions when the contribution would support sectarian activities.*
- *Organizations that discriminate on the basis of race, color, religion, gender, gender expression, age, national origin, disability, marital status, or sexual orientation in any of its activities or operations.*

Eligibility to Nominate:

Only Members who have signed an individual Commitment Form and are in good standing with their contributions may nominate an organization for funding consideration. The definition of a member in good standing is at the sole discretion of the Steering Committee but will include, at a minimum, consideration of the length of membership and fulfillment of contributions during the preceding 12 months.

New members are not eligible to submit an organization for consideration until they have signed an individual Commitment Form and have donated at the prior quarterly meeting.



MISSION STATEMENT AND GUIDELINES *(CONTINUED)*

Nomination Procedure and Selection of Nonprofit Organizations:

Submitting a Nomination

Members who wish to nominate an organization for consideration must complete and submit the Nonprofit Organization Nomination Form and work with the organization to submit their form and documents no later than two weeks prior to the meeting. Nomination forms may not be submitted at the meeting. A member may nominate more than one nonprofit, but only one nonprofit per member may be considered at a meeting.

Nomination Meeting Protocol

Prior to each meeting, three of the eligible organizations names will be randomly drawn.

A Q&A session will take place immediately after the presentations and directly preceding Member voting.

Each member will vote by ballot. Only members who are in attendance and who are in good standing with their contributions may vote. The majority rules. All Members are responsible for donating at their commitment level to the selected organization, regardless of their preference.

Nomination Selection and Funding Protocols

If a nominated organization is not selected for presentation at the quarterly meeting, the organization is eligible for consideration at subsequent meetings, or until such nonprofit is chosen.

If a organization is one of the three presented at the quarterly meeting and it is not funded, it will be held from the drawing pool for the next quarter, after which it is eligible for selection again.

If an organization is the recipient of funding, it will be not eligible for consideration for 3 years; however, the nominating member is still eligible to submit the name of another organization at subsequent meetings.

In the case of a tie, the membership will be provided with the names of the selected organizations, and their contribution will be divided in half with a donation to each organization.

Nonprofit Organization Agreement

The selected organization must agree not to use the names of the members for future solicitations or to distribute member information for any other public use or purpose. If the organization does not adhere to this condition, they will be removed from any future consideration.

The selected organization will agree to send a representative to the next meeting of 100+ WWCRI to inform the Membership about how the funds have been used.
